## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65270 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Donald L. Baker of 1111 Vermont Avenue, Boise, Idaho 83706, phone 344-1373, for the use of the waters of a spring, a tributary of Pine Creek,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 5, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second of water

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: South 70° East 1410' from the Northwest Corner of Section 20, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 20, Township 7 South, Range 48 East, WM, in the County of Baker.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 7 South, Range 48 East, WM

Section 20 NW I/4 NW I/4 Domestic use for one

Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 2, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
