PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65324 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Joann Sandstede, Jean C. Bradley and Donna J. Clough of 135 West Berdine Street, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 672-2409, for the use of the waters of the Clough Gulch, a tributary of South Umpqua River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden and stockwater, being 0.01 cubic foot per second for domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and* that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 19, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.02 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 4880 feet North and 1730 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 13, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 30 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* noncommercial garden and 0.01 cfs for stockwater

Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM Section 18 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use for one

family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial

garden

NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Stock watering NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Stock watering

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **December 20, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19, 35.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86,
