PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Ernest V. Lewis, United States Deschutes National Forest of Box 608, Camp Sherman, Oregon 97730, phone 595-6612, for the use of the waters of Metolius River,

domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 25, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.005 cubic foot per

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED:
1325 feet South and 2230 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 10, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 10, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Jefferson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM

Section 10 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial

garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 20, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 36 .
