## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 651 97 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Richard Lee Bramblett and Karen and Benjamin Carter of Coos River Route, Box 573 and Box 5714, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 267-3868 or 269-1945, for the use of the waters of Morin Creek, a tributary of East Fork Millicoma River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from June 15, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 870 feet North and 1215 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 33, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 33, Township 24 South, Range 11 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 24 South, Range 11 West, WM Section 33 SE 1/4 SE 1/4

SE 1/4 Domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 20, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
