PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65478 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Ernest Tucker Livingstone of 2577 NW Westover Road, Portland, Oregon 97210, phone 223-8971, for the use of the waters of Metolius River, a tributary of Deschutes,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of lawn and noncommercial garden not to exceed one-half acre

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 29, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 700 feet South and 340 feet East from the Center Corner of Section 10, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 10, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Jefferson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM Section 10 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 0.5 acre Irrigation Lot 4 Tract E

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 20, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
