PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65485 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Steiwer Ranches, Incorporated of PO Box 246, Fossil, Oregon 97830, phone 763-2288, for the use of the waters of Butte Creek and John Day River, a tributary of John Day River, being 0.27 cubic foot per second of water from Butte Creek when available with any* for the PURPOSE of irrigation and supplemental irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 1, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed $1.05 \ \mathrm{cfs}$

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Diversion 1-590 feet South and 1220 feet East from the C1/4 Corner of Section 7, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 7; Diversion 2-1000 feet North and 5450 feet East from the C1/4 Corner of Section 7, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 8; Diversion 3-7175 feet South and 1950 feet East from the C1/4 Corner of Section 7, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 18, all in Township 6 South, Range 19 East, WM, in** A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

- * deficiency in the available supply from Butte Creek tp be made up by appropriation from John Day River for irrigation of Tract 1 (11.7 acres); 0.18 cfs from John Day River for supplemental irrigation of Tract 2 (7.2 acres); and 0.60 cfs from John Day River to increase the rate of flow to the full duty for the irrigation of Tract 3 (48.1 acres),

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre Butte Creek and 5.0 acre-feet per acre John Day River for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before $\frac{December 20, 1984}{December 20, 1984}$, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86.
