### PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **65531** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Clyde E. Iron of 250 Lorain Avenue, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 267-2483, for the use of the waters of two springs, tributaries of Isthmus Slough,**

for the PURPOSE of **domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each, being 0.01 cubic foot per second of water from Spring 1 for Housesite 1 and 0.01 cfs from Spring 2 for Housesite 2** that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **August 12, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.02 cfs**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **Diversion 1 - 215 feet West and 68 feet North; Diversion 2 - 250 feet West and 150 feet North both from the E 1/4 Corner of Section 2, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 2, Township 26 South, Range 13 West, WM, in the County of Coos.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **December 20, 1984** , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85** .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **86** .
