PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65513 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Ronald W. Kunzman for U.S. Deschutes National Forest, 25868 NE Glass Road, Aurora, Oregon 97002, phone 678-1447, for the use of the waters of Metalius River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 8, 1983 for 0.0006 cubic feet per second and September 13, 1983 for 0.0044 cfs

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.005 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1725 feet North and 920 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 15, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 15, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Jefferson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM Section 15 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Domestic use Lot 5 Tract C

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **January 3, 1985**, and streasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.
