This permit is issued to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife of 506 SW Mill Street, Portland, Oregon 97201, phone 229-5701, for the use of the waters of Spring Creek, a tributary of Wallowa

for the PURPOSE of acclimation water for steelhead smolts at the Wallowa River Hatchery

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 24, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 17.0 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1520 feet North and 1860 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 3, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 3, Township 2 South, Range 44 East, WM, in the County of Wallowa.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 2 South, Range 44 East, WM Section 3 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Steelhead smolt acclimation pond

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 6, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
