## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65983 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Kenneth L. Hebard of 5907 SW Harmony Drive, Reseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 679-8552, for the use of the waters of an unnamed creek, a tributary of Litle River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 8, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1040 feet South and 550 feet East from the W 1/4 Cerner of Section 34, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 34, Township 26 South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.
