PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65987 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Chas F. McGeorge of Box 149, Sitkum Route, Myrtle Point, Oregon 97458, phone 572-5949, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, a tributary of East Fork Coquille River, for the PURPOSE of domestic use one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 8, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 740 feet North and 700 feet West from the Southwest Corner of Section 15, being within the SE I/4 SE I/4 of Section 16, Township 28 South, Range II West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 28 South, Range II West, WM Section 15 SW I/4 SW I/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **january 16, 1985**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 $\,$ 86 $\,$.
