PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 66054 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Patrick Michael Leonard and Christine Westphal of Box 17, Starveout Creek Road, Azalea, Oregon 97410, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream and reservoir, a tributary of Starveout Creek, to be constructed under Application R-66053, Permit R-9094, for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 14, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.025 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1260 feet South and 75 feet West from the E 1/4 Corner of Section 18, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 18, Township 32 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Section 18 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 2.0 acres Township 32 South, Range 4 West, WM

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/70 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of net to exceed 3.5 from direct flow and storage from reservoir to be constructed under Permit R-9094, and be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before january 16, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 &6.
