PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **66110** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Fun River Improvement District, c/o Myrl Byington, of Kernville Route, Box 252, Lincoln City, Oregon 97367, phone 996-3385,** for the use of the waters of a spring, a tributary of Sitely River, for the PURPOSE of **domestic use for 12 families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **September 19, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.01 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **540 feet North and 1190 feet West from the S 1/4 Corner of Section 12, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 12, Township 8 South, Range 11 West, WM, in the County of Lincoln.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **January 16, 1985** , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85** .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **86** .
