PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67095 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Tim Seals of 433 Riverside Drive, Myrtle Creek, Oregon 97457, phone 863-4791, for the use of the waters of North Myrtle Creek, a tributary of Myrtle Creek,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation and stockwater, being 0.038 cubic foot per second for irrigation and 0.005 cfs for stockwater

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 30, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.043 Cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1090 feet North and 820 feet East from the W1/4 Corner, Section 27, being within the SW1/4 NW1/4 of Section 27, Township 29 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 27 SW 1/4 NW 1/4 3.0 acres Irrigation SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Stockwater

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 15, 1985 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 196
