PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67327 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following

Orval H. Weaver of Box 195 North Myrtle Creek, Oregon 97457, phone This permit is issued to 863-3341, for the use of the waters of North Myrtle Creek, a tributary of Myrtle Creek,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 3, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.11 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 870 feet South and 650 feet East from the W 1/4 Corner, Section 18, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 18, Township 29 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 4 West, WM NW 1/4 SW 1/4 5.9 acres Section 18 Irrigation SW 1/4 SW 1/4 3.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 15, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986
