PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67350 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Clarence William Schulze of PO Box 1571, Bandon, Oregon 97411, phone 332-2881, for the use of the waters of Fourmile Creek,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family and irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 5, 1983 for 0.022 cubic foot per second and December 23, 1983 for 0.108 cfs

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.13 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 100 feet North and 296 feet East from the Southwest Corner of the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 10, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 10, Township 30 South, Range 14 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 30 South, Range 14 West, WM Section 10 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 10.0 acres Domestic

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 15, 1985 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with
