## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67354 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Lynn E. and Rose M. Cannon of 886 North Dean Street, Coquille, Oregon 97423, phone 396-3783, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream and reservoir, a tributary of Davis Creek, to be constructed under Application R-67353, Permit R-9270, for the PURPOSE of irrigation, temperature control, flood harvesting of cranberries; being 0.275 cubic foot per second for irrigation, 1.65 cfs for temperature control, and 0.55 cfs for flood harvesting provided the total quantity diverted shall not exceed 1.65 cfs that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 5, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.65 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1072 feet North and 495 feet West from the Southwest Corner of the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 13, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 30 South, Range 15 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows: Township 30 South, Range 15 West, WM Section 13 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 11.0 acres

Irrigation, flood harvesting and temperature control

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second of its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, for cranberries. If for the irrigation of any other crop, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The permittee shall record and submit annually to the Water Resources Department all pertinent data pertaining to use of water for temperature control (frost control) on forms furnished.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 15, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986
