PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67735 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following

This permit is issued to Robert Gordon Iler of 5371 Melqua Road, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 672-1364, for the use of the waters of Umpqua River, a tributary of Pacific

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 24.4 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 13, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.31 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 250 feet South and 365 feet East from the Northwest Corner of the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 24, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 24, Township 26 South, Range 7 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 7 West, WM Section 13 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 6.0 acres SE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.30 acre Section 24 NE 1/4 NE 1/4 0.70 acre NE 1/4 NW 1/4 9.0 acres NW 1/4 NE 1/4 8.0 acres NE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.40 acre

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 21, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986
