"CERTIFICATE NO. 6783/" PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65980 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Gordon E. Doke of PO Box 308, Port Orford, Oregon 97465, phone 347-4248, for the use of the waters of a spring and an unnamed stream, tributaries of Elk River, being 0.005 cubic foot per second from each source, provided the * for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from January 27, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.005 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Diversion 1-760 feet North and 300 feet West, Diversion 2-780 feet North and 150 feet West both from the S 1/4 Corner of Section 6, being within Government Lot 3, (SE 1/4 SW 1/4) of Section 6, Township 33 South, Range 14 West, WM, in the County of Curry.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* total quantity diverted shall not exceed 0.005 cfs,

Township 33 South, Range 14 West, WM Section 6 Lot 3 Domestic use

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 2, 1985 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.
