PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **67429** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Wayne Reynolds of Mist, Oregon 97016, phone 755-2472,** for the use of the waters of Nehalem River,

for the PURPOSE of **irrigation and stock water, being 0.0125 cubic foot per second for irrigation of 1.0 acre and 0.005 cfs for stock water**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **October 7, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.0125 cfs**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **2245 feet North and 3060 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 14, being within NE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 14, Township 6 North, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Columbia.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 6 North, Range 5 West, WM Section 14 NE 1/4 SW 1/4 1.0 acre Irrigation and livestock water to be irrigated

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **March 2, 1985**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before **October 1, 1985**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before **October 1, 1986**.
