PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67512 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Hal L. Davis of Star Route, Port Orford, Oregon 97465, phone 332-9847, for the use of the waters of a spring,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 11, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 33 feet North and 343 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 20, being within SE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 20, Township 32 South, Range 15 West, WM, in the County of Curry.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 32 South, Range 15 West, WM Section 21 SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden each

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 2, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986.
