## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68000 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Roy L. Anderson of 182-C, South Myrtle Route, Myrtle Creek, Oregon 97457, for the use of the waters of South Myrtle Creek, a tributary of Myrtle Creek,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 34.8 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from January 18, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.44 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1900 feet North and 1520 feet East from the W 1/4 Corner of Section 30, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 30, Township 29 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 4 West, WM Section 19 SW 1/4 SW 1/4 12.5 acres SE 1/4 SW 1/4 18.0 acres SW 1/4 SE 1/4 1.0 acres Section 30 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 0.8 acre NE 1/4 NW 1/4 2.5 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 9, 1985 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86
