PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67920 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Roy Kilpatrick of PO Box 13, Mt. Vernon, Oregon 97865, phone 932-4455, for the use of the waters of Fall Creek, a tributary of Beech Creek,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 25.0 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 14, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.625 Cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1650 feet South and 1170 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 14, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 14, Township 13 South, Range 30 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 30 East, WM Section 14 NW 1/4 SW 1/4 10.0 acres Section 15 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 15.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 16, 1985 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
