PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 66897 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to M.E. and R.G. Boak of PO Box 37, Bandon, Oregon 97411, phone 347-3598, for the use of the waters of Two Mile Creek,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 9.5 acres, temperature control and flood harvesting of cranberries, being 0.24 cubic foot per second for irrigation, 1.9 cfs for temperature control and 0.635 cfs for flood harvesting that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 27, 1983 for 1.11 cfs and February 24, 1984 for 0.79 cfs

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.9 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1500 feet South and 1900 feet East from the W 1/4 Corner of Section 13, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 13, Township 29 South, Range 15 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 15 West, WM Section 13 SE 1/4 NW 1/4 1.7 acres Irrigation,
SW 1/4 NW 1/4 3.6 acres Temperature
NE 1/4 SW 1/4 4.2 acres control and
NE 1/4 SW 1/4 3.2 acres flood harvest

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to $\frac{1}{40}$ of one cubic foot per second of its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, for cranberries. If for the irrigation of any other crop, this appropriation shall be limited to $\frac{1}{80}$ of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 19, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1987.
