PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **66944** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **William G. Kirk of Hamlet Route, Box 1311, Seaside, Oregon 97138,** for the use of the waters of a spring,

for the PURPOSE of **domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **September 28, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.01 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **510 feet North and 1110 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Government Lot 14, being within Lot 14 (SE 1/4 NW 1/4) of Section 5, Township 4 North, Range 8 West, WM, in the County of Clatsop.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 4 North, Range 8 West, WM Section 5 Lot 14 (SE 1/4 NW 1/4) Domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and non-commercial garden each

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **April 19, 1985**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **86**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **87**.
