PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67947 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Our Lady of Guadalupe Trappist Monastery of Box 97, Lafayette, Oregon 97127, phone 852-7174, for the use of the waters of a seepage area, a tributary of Millican Creek, for the PURPOSE of domestic uses at abbey including washing, food service and watering of flowers

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 14, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 10.4 gallons per minute

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1519.5 feet South and 991 feet East from the Northwest Corner of T.J. Hubbard DLC 52, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 30, Township 3 South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Yamhill.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 3 South, Range 3 West, WM Section 29 SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use for washing, food service and watering of flowers

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 19, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87 .
