PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **66153** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **District Manager, Bureau of Land Management of 74 South Alvord Avenue, Burns, Oregon 97720, phone 573-5241, for the use of the waters of 1084-Big Spring, a tributary of Middle Fork Malheur River,** for the PURPOSE of **livestock and wildlife consumption**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **September 19, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.002 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1055 feet North and 3235 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 29, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 29, Township 18 South, Range 34 East, WM, in the County of Harney.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 18 South, Range 34 East, WM Section 29 SE 1/4 SW 1/4 **livestock and wildlife**

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **April 25, 1985** and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **86**.
