PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 61532 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to C.H. or Georgia M. Hemenway of Route 1, Box 5, Huntington, Oregon 97907, phone 869-2379, for the use of the waters of Dixie Creek, a tributary of Burnt River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 0.5 acre

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 13, 1981

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 215 feet South and 1420 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 16, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 16, Township 13 South, Range 44 East, WM, in the County of Baker.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 44 East, WM Section 16 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 0.5 acre

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 The acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 14, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
