PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67545 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Randall R. Delco and Pennie D. Delco, of Route 1, Box 81A, Tygh Valley, Oregon 97063, phone 483-2396, for the use of the waters of Tygh Creek, a tributary of White River, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 4.5 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 12, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 780 feet South and 200 feet West from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 36, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 36, Township 3 South, Range 12 East, WM, in the County of Wasco.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 3 South, Range 12 East, WM Section 36 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 2.8 acres
 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 1.7 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 11, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
