PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65263 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to James C. St. John of Star Route, Box 240, Union, Oregon 97883, phone 562-5086, for the use of the water from Catherine Creek, a tributary of the Grande Ronde River,
 for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 42.2 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 5, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.06 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 770 feet North and 470 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 13, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 4 South, Range 39 East, WM, in the County of Union.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 4 South, Range 39 East, WM Section 13 SW 1/4 NW 1/4 23.6 acres
 SE 1/4 NW 1/4 18.6 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 22, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
