PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68057 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Calvin Charles Davis of Route 2, Box 358C, Forest Grove, Oregon 97116, phone 357-4954, for the use of the waters from an unnamed stream,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 11, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1415.03 feet South and 917 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 5, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 5, Township 1 North, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 1 North, Range 4 West, WM Section 5 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 0.5 acre
Tax Lot 405 Domestic

Provided further water shall not be appropriated during the period from July 31 through September 15 of each year except for human consumption.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 19, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
