## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64414 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to United States, Umpqua National Forest of PO Box 1008, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 672-6601, for the use of the waters from an unnamed spring, a tributary of North Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of sanitary use at Fall Creek trailhead restrooms

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 5, 1982

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.001 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 200 feet South and 650 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 17, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 17, Township 26 South, Range 1 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 1 West, WM Section 17 NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sanitary use

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 19, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19, 86.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
