PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68120 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to William J. Doyle of 4187 Riverbanks Road, Grants Pass, Oregon 97527, phone 476-0624, for the use of the waters of Dutcher Creek when available with any deficiency in available supply from Dutcher Creek, a tributary of Rogue River, to* for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 18, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Dutcher Creek - 2475 feet North and 740 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 14, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 14; Rogue River - 2840 feet North and 1150 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 14, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 14, Township 36 South, Range 7 Weet, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

be made up by appropriation from Rogue River, provided that the total quantity diverted from both sources shall not exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second,

Township 36 South, Range 7 West, WM Section 14 NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Domestic use for one family

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 31, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87 .
