PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64057 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to U.S. Government - Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 882-7761, for the use of the waters of Scott Creek, a tributary of Klamath Marsh, for the PURPOSE of road construction, maintenance and dust abatement, provided the total volume of water diverted shall not exceed 4.0 acre-feet per year

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 1, 1982

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 2320 feet North and 320 feet West from the South Quarter Corner of Section 16, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 16, Township 31 South, Range 7 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 30 South, Range 7 East, WM	Sections 5, 6,7,8, 16 through 22 Section 23 W 1/2 Sections 26 through 34 ALL
Township 30 South, Range 6 East, WM	Sections 1,2 11,12,13, 14,23,24,25 26,35,36 ALL Section 3 E 1/2 E 1/2 W 1/2

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 14, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
