PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 62736 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to United States, Ochoco National Forest of 2321 E. Third Street, Prineville, Oregon 97754, phone 447-3825, for the use of the waters of Hunt Spring, a tributary of Little McKay Creek, for the PURPOSE of stockwater

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 11, 1981

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.0004 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1733 feet South and 2393 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 24, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 24, Township 12 South, Range 17 East, WM, in the County of Crook.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 12 South, Range 17 East, WM Section 24 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Stockwater

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 23, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
