PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65712 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to United States Mt. Hood National Forest of 2955 NW Division, Gresham, Oregon 97030, phone 667-0511, for the use of the waters of Hillside Spring and Doyles Spring, tributaries to North Fork Mill Creek, being 0.002 cubic foot per * for the PURPOSE of livestock water

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 26, 1983 for 0.002 cfs and March 15, 1984 for 0.002 cfs

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.004 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Hillside Spring - 1320 feet South and 1980 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 14, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 14; Doyles Spring - 130 feet North and 1716 feet West from the 1/4 Corner of Sections 11 and 12, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 11, both within Township 1 South, Range 10 East, WM, in the County of Hood River.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* second from each,

Township 1 South, Range 10 East, WM Section 14 SE 1/4 NW 1/4 Livestock water

Section 11 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Doyle's Spring Livestock water

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 27, 1985 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1987.
