PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68145 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to John E. Borden of 4678 Treeside Drive, NE, Salem, Oregon 97305, phone 393-8736, for the use of the waters of a spring, a tributary of Nehalem River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 6, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 750 feet North and 900 feet East from the W 1/4 Corner of Section 18, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 18, Township 4 North, Range 7 West, WM, in the County of Clatsop.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 4 North, Range 7 West, WM Section 18 Lot 3 (SW 1/4 NW 1/4) Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 27, 1985 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86. Extended to October 1, 1988

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87 . Extended to October 1, 1988
