PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68168 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following

This permit is issued to Morris E. Van Billiard of SIMA SF BLDG. 162, NAS Alameda. California, phone (415)869-2548, for the use of the waters of Fish Creek, a tributary of Drews Creek for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 2.0 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 4, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.05 cubic foot per

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 10 feet South and 10 feet East from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 8, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 8, Township 39 South, Range 18 East, WM, in the County of Lake.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 39 South, Range 18 East, WM Section 8 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 2.0 acres Irrigation

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
