## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION

and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Frederick Marshall McCoy, c/o F. Bauer, of 1575 Swan Hill Road, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 679-5392, for the use of the waters of Olalla Creek, a tributary of Lookingglass Creek, provided the total diverted shall not exceed 5000 \* for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family and livestock, being 0.005 cfs for domestic use and 0.005 cfs for livestock

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 2, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed second, being 0.005 cfs for domestic use and 0.005 cfs for stock

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 270 feet South and 230 feet West from the Center Corner of Section 23, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 23, Township 28 South, Range 7 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 28 South, Range 7 West, WM Section 23 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Domestic use for one family and stock

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 21, 1985 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
