PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **64177** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **U.S. Government, Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 882-7761,** for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, a tributary of Upper Klamath Lake, provided the total quantity diverted shall not * for the PURPOSE of **road construction and maintenance**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **September 27, 1982**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **1.0 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **250 feet North and 1100 feet East from the W 1/2 Corner of Section 6, being within Lot 5 (SW 1/4 NW 1/4) of Section 6, Township 37 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* **exceed 2.0 acre-feet per year,**

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **December 7, 1985**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **86**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **87**.
