PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **64822** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **U.S. Government, Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 882-7761, for the use of the waters of Muddy Spring and an unnamed spring, tributaries of Buck Lake, being 0.005 cfs from each,** for the PURPOSE of **livestock**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **February 2, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.01 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **Diversion 1 (Muddy Spring) - 190 feet North and 2100 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 34, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 34, Township 37 South, Range 5 East, WM; Diversion 2 (Unnamed Spring) - 50 feet North and 2200 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 2, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 2, Township 38 South, Range 5 East, WM, both in the County ***

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 37 South, Range 5 East, WM	Section 34 SE 1/4 SW 1/4	Livestock
Township 38 South, Range 5 East, WM	Section 11 NE 1/4 NW 1/4	Livestock

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **December 7, 1985** and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **86**

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **87**.
