PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

68113 This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

Leslie McFarland and Georgiana McFarland of PO Box 815, Sutherlin, This permit is issued to Oregon 97479, phone 459-3859, for the use of an unnamed stream and unnamed reservoir to be constructed under Application R-68112, Permit R-10051, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 8.8 acres

July 2, 1984 that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

0.11 cubic foot per and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed second

1620 feet South and 3350 feet West from the Northeast The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Corner of Section 24, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 24, Township 25 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 25 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 24 SE 1/4 NW 1/4 5.6 acres NE 1/4 NW 1/4 3.2 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

December 21, 1985 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with Actual construction work shall begin on or before reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
