PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68133 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Frank J. and Helen L. Knab of 3090 Granite Hill Road, Grants Pass, Oregon 97526, phone 479-1985, for the use of water from Louse Creek, a tributary of Jump-Off Joe Creek, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of one-half acre noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 26, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 660 feet South and 100 feet East from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 29, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 29, Township 35 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 35 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 29 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 One-half acre noncommercial garden

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 21, 1985 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
