PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68211 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Robert L. and Sharon M. Cook of 625 Upper Loop Road, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 267-7829, for the use of a creek, a tributary of Isthmus Slough,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 25, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.01 cubic foot per**second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1513 feet South and 1725 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 2, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Corner of Section 2, Township 27 South, Range 13 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 27 South, Range 13 West, WM Section 2 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 21, 1985 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
