PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68100 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to George Horning of Route 3, Box 588, Corvallis, Oregon 97333, phone 753-3004, for the use of waste water from dairy and two Horning Reservoirs to be constructed under Application R-68099, Permit R-10060 and 40.0 acre-feet stored * for the PURPOSE of irrigation and supplemental irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 10, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.83 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Dairy Waste - 1400 feet North and 850 feet East from the Southwest Corner of DLC 44, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 16, Township 14 South, Range 5 West; Reservoirs - 1200 feet North and 600 feet East of the Southwest Corner of DLC 44, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4; Long Tom River - 1200 feet North and 1450 feet East from the Southwest Corner of DLC 44, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4, ** A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

- * water only from Fern Ridge Reservoir constructed under Application 29397, Permit R-1625, a tributary of Lone Tom River,
- ** Section 4, Township 14 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Benton.

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and is subject to the terms and conditions of Contract 5-07-10-W0528 between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant, or a satisfactory replacement, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Director, provided further that although use of waste water from the dairy and two Horning Reservoirs declared herein to be for supplemental irrigation in part, the right may in the interest of proper operation of the dairy and waste water reservoirs, be exercised at times when water is available at the primary source provided that the total quantity diverted from all sources of supply does not exceed the limitation allowed herein, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 28, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1987.
