PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **64225** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **United States - Wallowa Whitman National Forest of PO Box 38, Unity, Oregon 97884, phone 446-3351, for the use of Antelope Spring,**

for the PURPOSE of **stock water**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **September 29, 1982**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **1.5 gallons per minute**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1100 feet North and 1000 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 12, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 12, Township 10 South, Range 36 East, WM, in the County of Baker.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 10 South, Range 36 East, WM Section 12 SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Stockwater

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **January 14, 1986**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **86**

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **87**.
