PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to United States, Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 883-6714, for the use of the waters of Dice Crane Spring and an unnamed spring, tributaries of Hog Creek, being 0.005 cubic foot per * for the PURPOSE of livestock

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 22, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cfs, being 0.005 cfs from each spring

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: A - 2200 feet North and 1800 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 24, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 24; B - 400 feet North and 250 feet West from the Southwest Corner of Section 25, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 25, both in Township 32 South, Range 8 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* second from each spring,

Township 32 South, Range 8 East, WM Section 24 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Livestock Section 25 SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Livestock

Actual construction work shall begin on or before Harch 11, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
