PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

KLAMATH

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 66695 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to United States, Winema National Forest of PU Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 883-6714, for the use of the waters of Lost Creek and Lost Creek Reservoir to be constructed under * for the PURPOSE of road maintenance, construction and dust apatement, provided the total quantity of water diverted shall not exceed 5.0 acre-feet per year

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 22, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: A - 300 feet North and 200 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 13; B - 300 feet North and 2400 feet West from the Southwest Corner of Section 13, both in Township 28 South, Range 8 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 28 South, Range 8 East, WM Section 1, Road maintenance, 2, 11, 12, construction, and 13, 14, 24 ALL dust abatement Township 28 South, Range 9 East, WM Section 5, Road maintenance, 6, 7, 8, 17, 18, 19, construction, and dust abatement 20 Al I

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 11, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
