PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **66696** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **United States, Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 883-6714,** for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, a tributary of Klamath Marsh and Weyerhaeuser Reservoir to be constructed * for the PURPOSE of **road maintenance, construction and dust abatement,** provided further that the total quantity of water appropriated shall not exceed **3.0 acre-feet per year** that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **September 22, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.5 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **2400 feet North and 2400 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 5, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 5, Township 29 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **March 11, 1986** , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **86.**

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **87.**
