## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65250 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Donald Flower of 4600 Little Applegate Road, Jacksonville, Oregon 97530, phone 899-7575, for the use of the waters of an unnamed reservoir, a tributary of Litle Applegate River, to be constructed under Application R-68249, Permit R-10450, for the PURPOSE of stockwater and supplemental irrigation of 0.4 acre, being 0.1 af for stockwater and 0.2 af for supplemental irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

January 3, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed

0.3 acre-foot

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 65 feet South and 530 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 19, being within SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 19, Township 39 South, Range 2 West, WM, in the County of Jackson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 39 South, Range 2 West, WM Section 19 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 4.0 acres Supplemental and stockwater irrigation

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet from storage from reservoir to be constructed under R 10450.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 25, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1987.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
